## Membership Policy

There are five categories of membership:

1. **Personal:** Any individual engaged in some form of Law Librarianship. *Fee - US \$20.00.*
2. **Institutional:** Any organization that has a legal collection or a collection of government documents. *Fee - US \$100.00*
3. **Associate:** Any individual or organization not eligible for personal or institutional membership. *Fee - US \$15.00*
4. **Student:** Any student registered as a student in librarianship or law. *Fee - US \$5.00*
5. **Honorary:** Conferred by the CARALL Executive Committee to an individual who has made substantial contribution to Law Librarianship, the legal profession or to CARALL. *Free*
